## **Online Teaching Certification Seminar:**

Our next S&T faculty redesigned Seminar starts on October 7<sup>th</sup> and runs until November 24<sup>th</sup>. The OTCS is designed to familiarize instructors with the information they need to deliver quality online learning experiences. The seminar supports the UM System-wide requirement that instructors teaching online courses be certified before teaching online. Quality Course Reviews have begun. Quality Course Reviews ensure that the course meets high pedagogical standards and is designed with students' best educational experiences in mind. It will also fulfill the UM system requirement that courses taught online go through a Quality Course Review. ## Mid Semester Feedback - (student feedback from Oct 5 – 13)

- Why do Mid-Semester Feedback? These surveys allow you to check-in with your students, see how they are doing, and make adjustments to your course to benefit your current students.
- This semester, FS2024, both Mid-Semester Feedback surveys will be conducted using Blue software by Explorance. This software will help us more easily manage the survey process and provide faculty with quicker access to their survey results. Blue integrates with Canvas and sends out automatic reminders to your students.
- Mid-Semester Feedback is voluntary participation. All teachers can choose to participate by opting in, but they are not required to participate.
